# Foreword by Paolo Silveri

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The International Fund for Agricultural Development (IFAD) is proud to have joined forces with the International Policy Centre for Inclusive Growth (IPC-IG) to map rural poverty in Brazil, as well as to identify the relationship between key pockets of poverty and the main economic activity of households. As the international community garners political will and financial resources to achieve the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) in 2030, and keeping in mind the successes in achieving the first Millennium Development Goal (MDG 1)—particularly by Brazil—IFAD is interested in intensifying its cooperation with other development agencies such as the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP). It will spare no effort to eliminate rural poverty and hunger still in this generation.

The Atlas of Poverty focuses mainly on the states in the North and Northeast regions of Brazil, where the majority of the country's poor rural households are located. Furthermore, these regions encompass IFAD initiatives in the country, with six rural development projects already under way, comprising a total portfolio of around USD450 million—the largest in the Latin America and Caribbean region. Around two thirds of the 19 million people who live in rural areas of these regions are potentially targeted by ongoing and future IFAD investment projects, being classified as poor (having a monthly per capita income of less than BRL140).

It is essential to understand the current spatial distribution of poverty and extreme poverty in Brazil to analyse the

impacts of cash transfer social security programmes on the country's rural poor. It is also crucial to highlight areas deserving of special attention in the design and implementation of future policies targeting the reduction of rural poverty. This is very timely for IFAD, given that the Fund is redesigning its Country Strategic Opportunities Programme (COSOP), together with the Government of Brazil, to be jointly implemented between 2016 and 2021.

IFAD will continue to support rural poverty alleviation in Brazil through the development of both agricultural and non-agricultural activities, the improvement of access to the rural production market, as well as the provision of capacity-building initiatives and empowerment of traditional rural communities. While seeking innovations in policies and projects, it will maintain its general principles of fighting poverty by enhancing ethnic minorities' decision-making roles, creating opportunities for young people, fostering environmental conservation and promoting climate-smart innovations.

It is our hope that this Atlas will help the Fund and its development partners, national and international alike, to keep improving and raising the bar of performance and results-based management, as required by the scope and ambition of the SDGs.

I wish you a pleasant and informative read.

## Atlas of extreme poverty in the North and Northeast Regions: resident population by agricultural, pluriactive, non-agricultural rural and non-agricultural urban households. Brazil, 2010

Poverty and extreme poverty have been decreasing significantly in Brazil. Between 2004 and 2013, poverty decreased from 20 per cent to just over 9 per cent of the population, while extreme poverty fell from around 7 per cent to 4 per cent in the same period. A considerable part of this decrease was due to the expansion of the labour market and significant increases in transfers to the poor, both by social security and through the *Bolsa Família* programme. Unfortunately, this progress has stagnated. Between 2012 and 2013, extreme poverty increased slightly, and poverty remained stable. The labour market is deteriorating rapidly, and the fiscal scenario has gone from being relatively favourable to quite concerning. Data indicate that the two driving forces behind the reduction in poverty rates—the labour market and transfers to the poor—are unable to keep the same pace they had in the previous decade.

In addition, while poverty has decreased, many of its characteristics remain constant. In geographical terms, little has changed. The North and the Northeast regions of the country are still, by far, the poorest; so too are the rural areas in any other region.

The objective of this Atlas is to identify the municipalities in the North and Northeast regions of the country in which there is a greater concentration of extreme poverty. To that end, microdata from the Demographic Census of 2010 are used. In dealing with thousands of municipalities, few instruments are as useful as poverty maps; colour-coded maps convey much more efficiently than tables or figures a sense of where the most needy populations are located.

Before the maps themselves are presented, it is essential to explain some concepts that will be the foundation of the analysis that follows. First, we define the poverty and extreme poverty thresholds adopted, and then we offer an alternative to the official Brazilian Institute of Geography and Statistics (IBGE) definitions of 'rural' and 'urban'.

According to the IBGE, the North and Northeast regions of Brazil comprise 16 states (seven in the North and nine in the Northeast) and are broadly recognised as the poorest regions in a country characterised by great regional inequalities.

Not only in Brazil but also in most places, poverty is a term which greatly depends on the eye of the beholder. Over the last decades, a number of different definitions of poverty have been used in the country. Of greater historical importance is poverty as defined in terms of the minimum caloric intake necessary for survival. This definition uses monetary poverty lines, which usually vary by region, estimated according to minimum caloric needs. Brazil has had a long history of these poverty estimates being implemented by various researchers, which perhaps explains why an agreement on a set of baseline thresholds for an official poverty line has never been reached.

In 2003, weary of endless disagreements among academics, the Federal Government declared that BRL50 and BRL100 would be the criteria for the definition of extreme poverty and poverty, respectively, to be used by the *Bolsa Família* programme. Since then, those thresholds have been used by many scholars as practically official lines, adjusted only by consumer inflation each year. They are quite useful for often being similar to lines used for international comparisons, of USD1 and USD2 per capita per day. In June 2011, with the institution of the *Brasil sem Miséria* programme, the extreme poverty and poverty lines were officially set at BRL50 and BRL100 (or BRL70 and BRL140 when adjusted for inflation). These are the lines adopted by this Atlas.

A peculiarity of Brazil is the fact that 'rural' is a concept just as complex as 'poverty'. If the lack of an official definition has been a problem for the measurement of poverty for a long time, so too has an excessively official definition of rural. It is up to municipal mayors to determine whether a given region constitutes a rural area; the IBGE is legally obliged to accept the designation declared by a municipality. The problem is that, if a mayor defines an area as urban, taxes are then collected over urban properties. Not only do rural areas yield significantly fewer taxes, but the mayors must also share half of their tax revenue with the Federal Government. This agreement has given rise to a controversial and somewhat unreliable definition of what constitutes 'urban' and 'rural' in Brazil.

This Atlas has adopted four definitions of 'rural settings' and uses the official rural/urban seals issued by municipalities as one of the three

criteria. The other criteria refer to the classification of a household as agricultural or not. Therefore, the typology of households as defined by this analysis is as follows:

1. *Agricultural households*: any household where at least one household member is employed in agriculture, and 67 per cent or more of labour income originates from agricultural activities.
2. *Pluriactive households*: those where at least one member of the household is employed in agriculture, but less than 67 per cent of labour income is derived from agriculture.
3. *Non-agricultural rural households*: those located in officially designated rural areas but without any household members working in agriculture.
4. *Non-agricultural urban households*: those located in officially urban areas but without any household members working in agriculture.

With the concepts of poverty and rurality duly clarified, we continue with a broader analysis of municipal poverty in Brazil, with a focus on the North and Northeast regions.

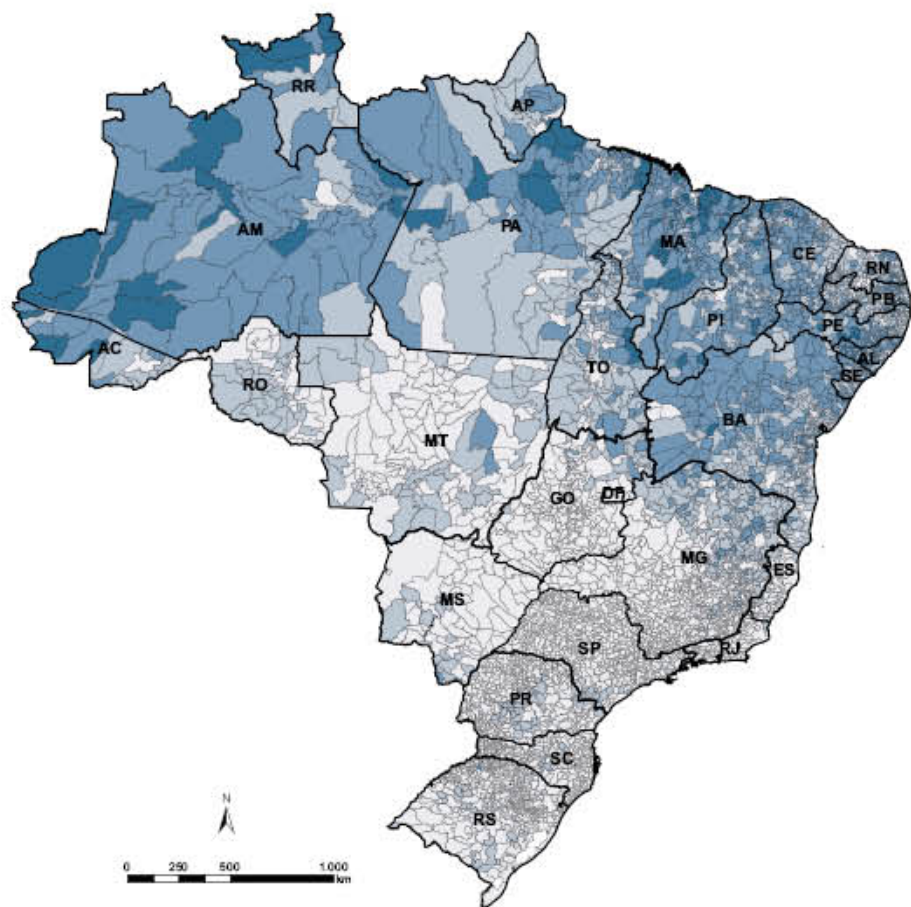
Figure 1 clearly shows that poverty is essentially a problem for the North and Northeast regions of the country. Few municipalities in the other three regions of Brazil present poverty rates over 40 per cent, and in many municipalities those rates are under 20 per cent.

In the North and the Northeast regions, however, the situation is quite different. Many municipalities present poverty rates above 40 per cent, and some as high as 60 per cent. This is illustrated by the darker blue shaded areas of the map. Of special note are the very poor areas in the northwestern part of both regions, which represent the poorest of the poor.

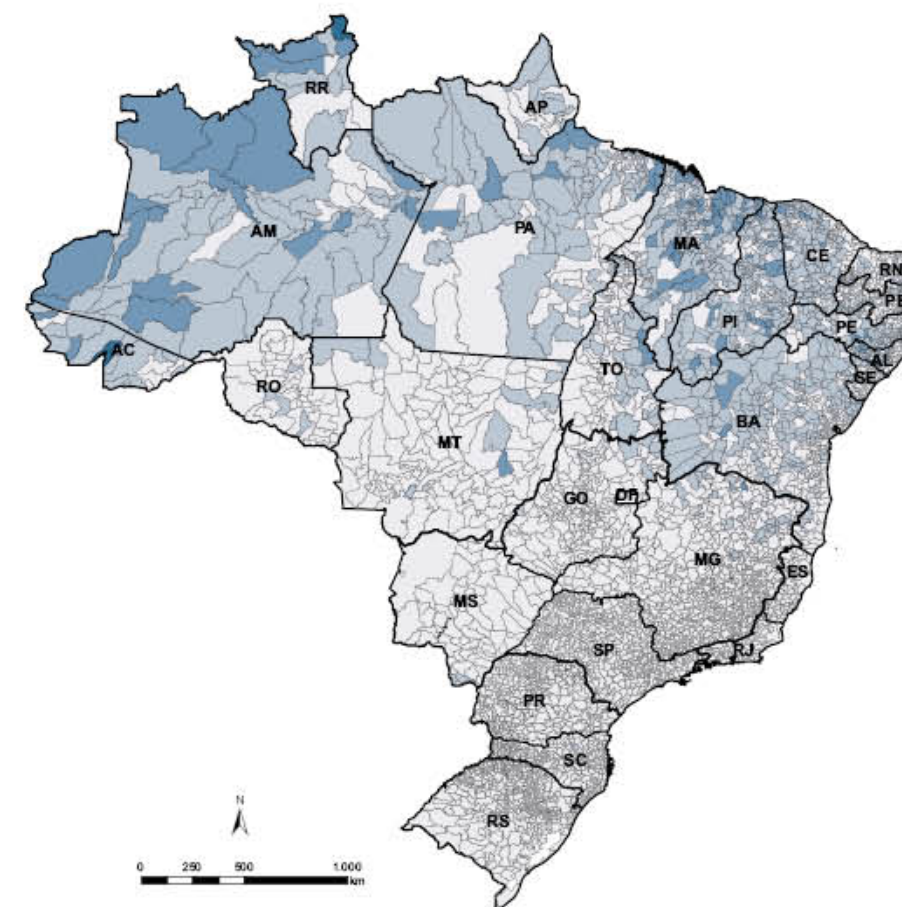
The same can be said for extreme poverty: the North and Northeast regions of the country have a much higher prevalence of extreme poverty than other regions, and the extremely poor populations are concentrated in their northwestern areas.

Figure 1: Percentage of the population living in poverty (BRL140) and extreme poverty (BRL70)—Brazil, 2010

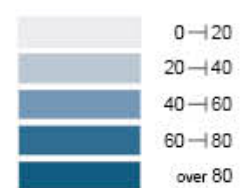

Extreme poverty

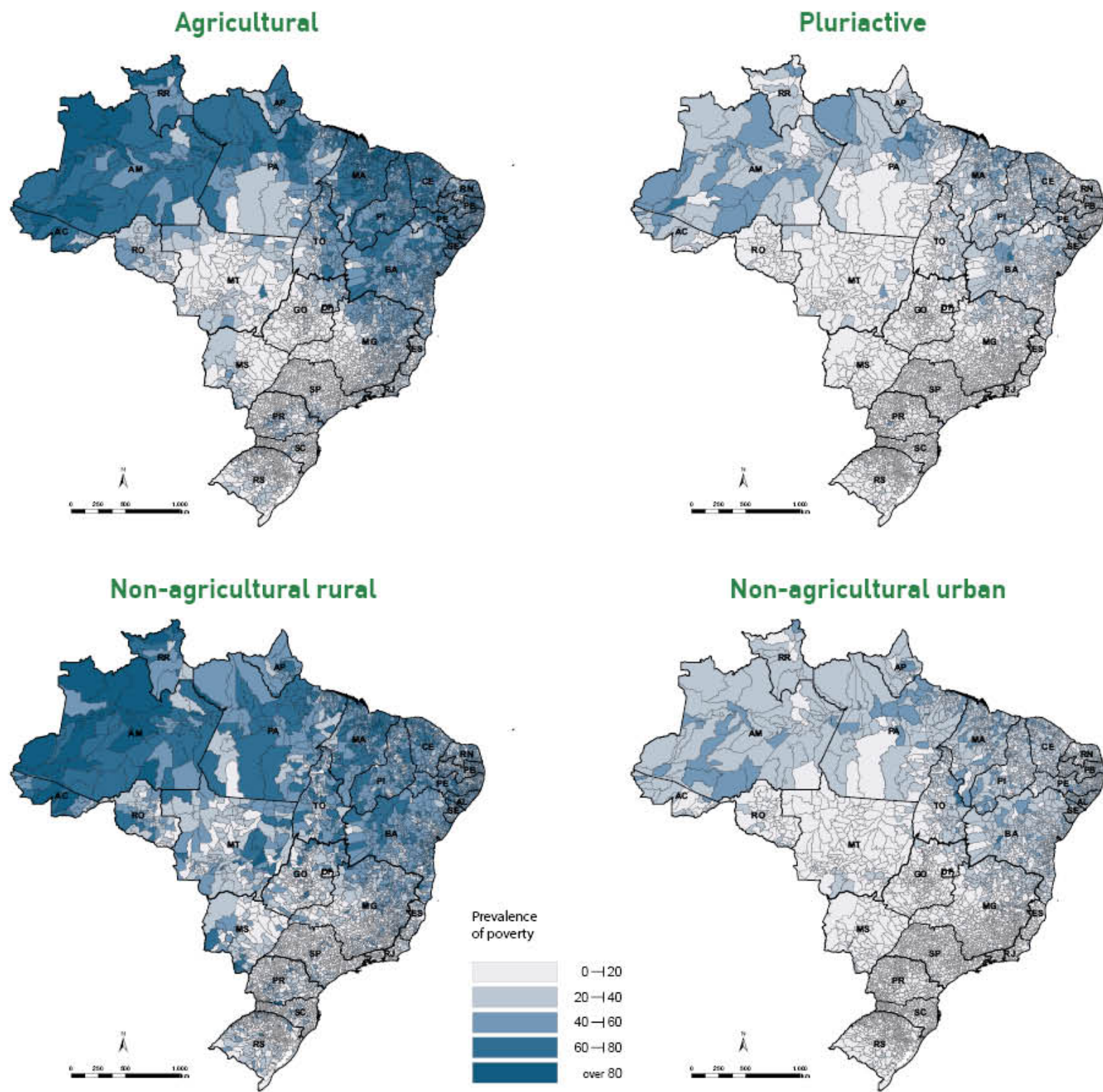


Prevalence of poverty/extreme poverty

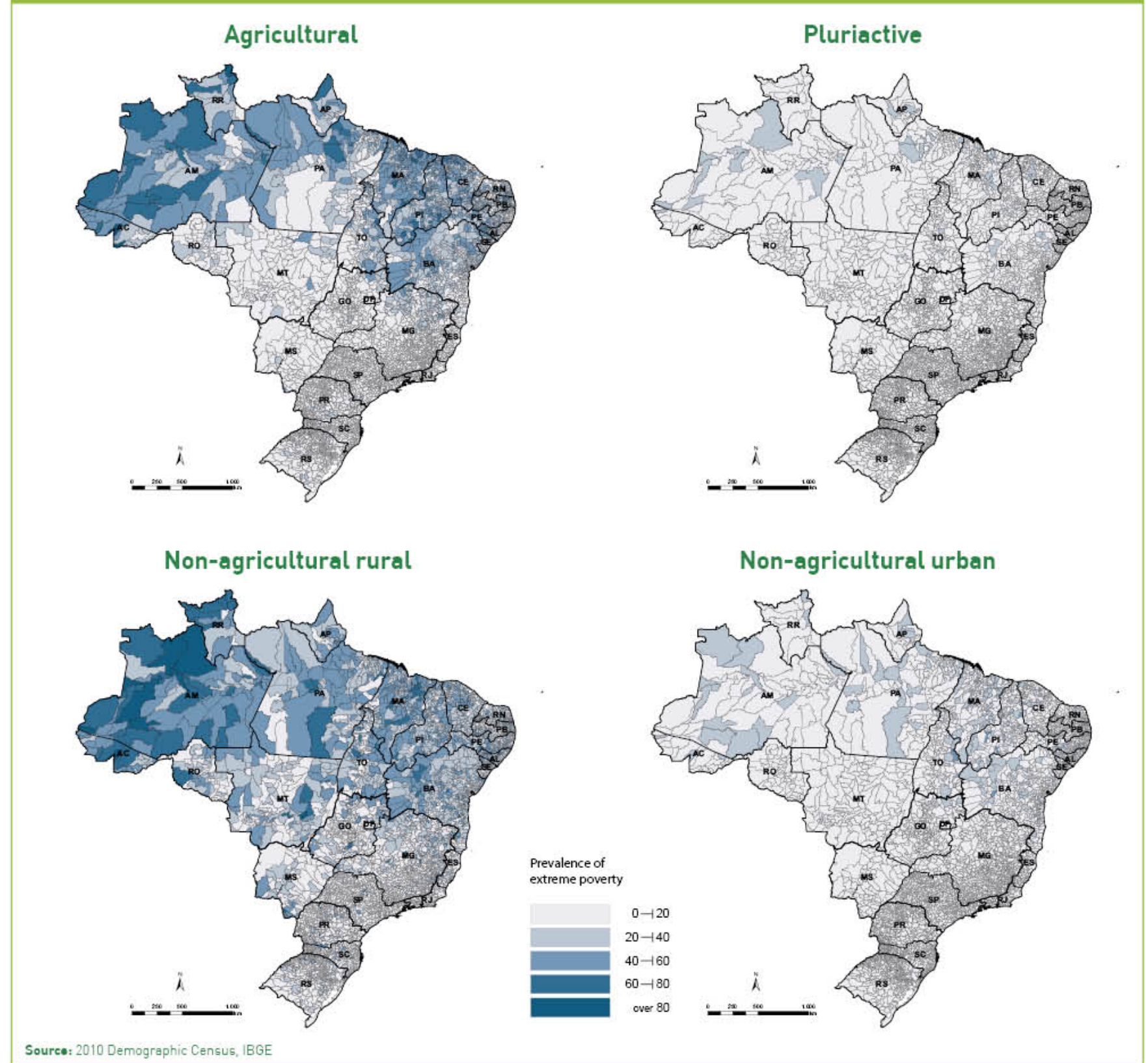
In analysing the rural dimension, according to the four previously defined categories of rurality (Figure 2), it can be observed that the differences are even more pronounced in some cases.

The maps reveal that there are very acute differences among agricultural households. The dark blue area in the western Amazon is especially alarming. The state of Maranhão, in the northeastern area of the Northeast region, also presents extremely high levels of rural poverty.

The extreme poverty maps (Figure 3) exhibit lighter shades. This does not come as a surprise, since the extreme poverty line is lower—which means that the proportion of extremely poor people will always be lower. That aside, the main results still hold: marked differences between agricultural households and higher regional homogeneity in pluriactive and non-agricultural urban households

These maps very clearly show that the problem of rural poverty in Brazil is largely a problem of agricultural households in the North and Northeast regions of the country.

The objective of this Atlas is to show where the highest rates of municipal extreme poverty are concentrated in the North and Northeast regions of the country. It contains a total of 80 state maps based on the 2010 Demographic Census. For each of the 16 states in these regions, five maps are presented, depicting the levels of municipal extreme poverty, considering not only the state as a whole, but also the four categories of rurality: the population residing in agricultural households, pluriactive households, non-agricultural rural households and non-agricultural urban households.

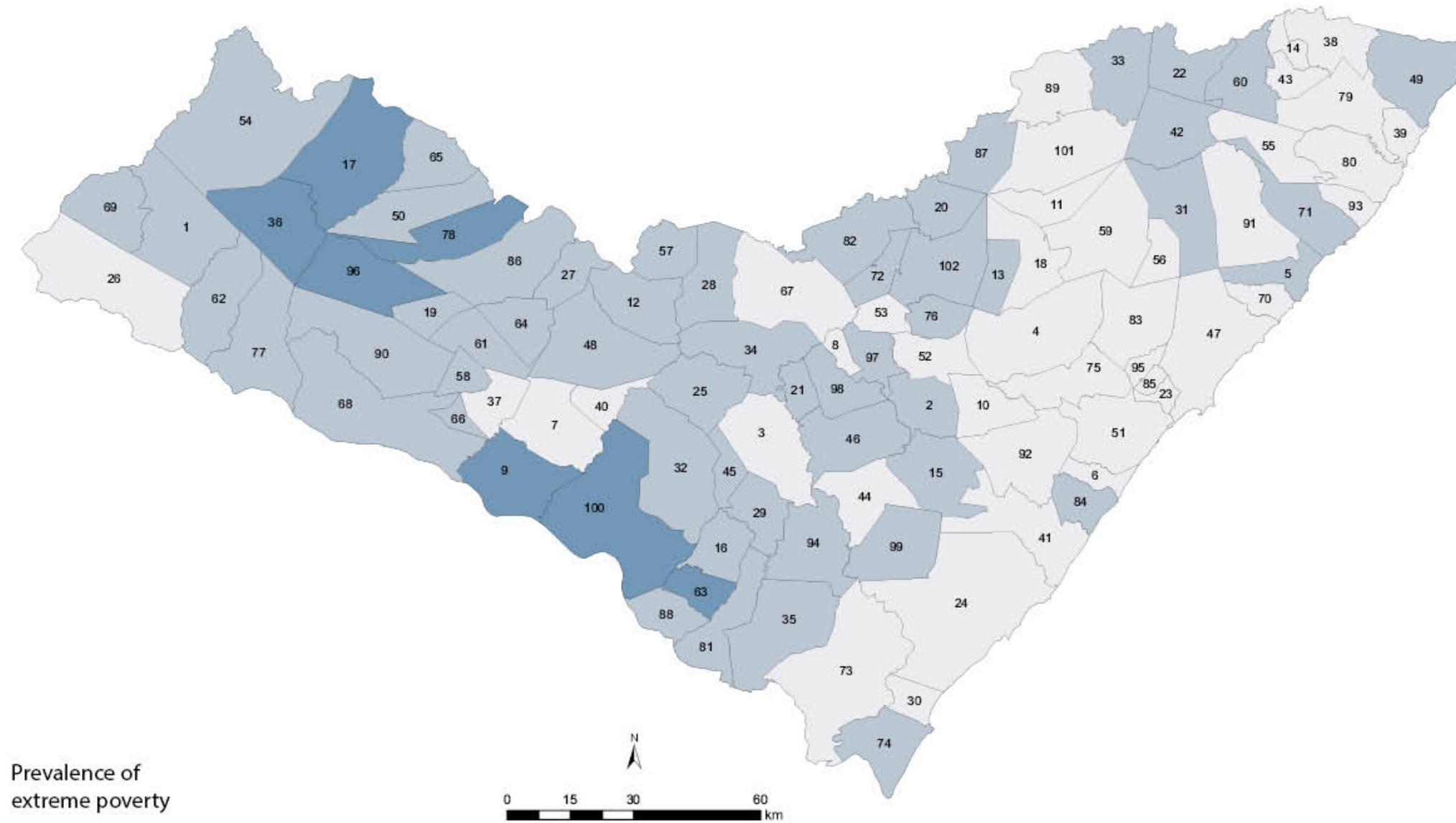

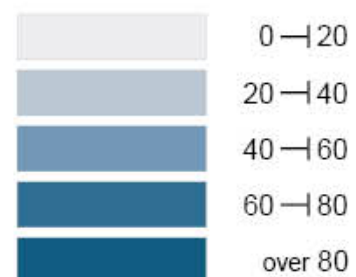

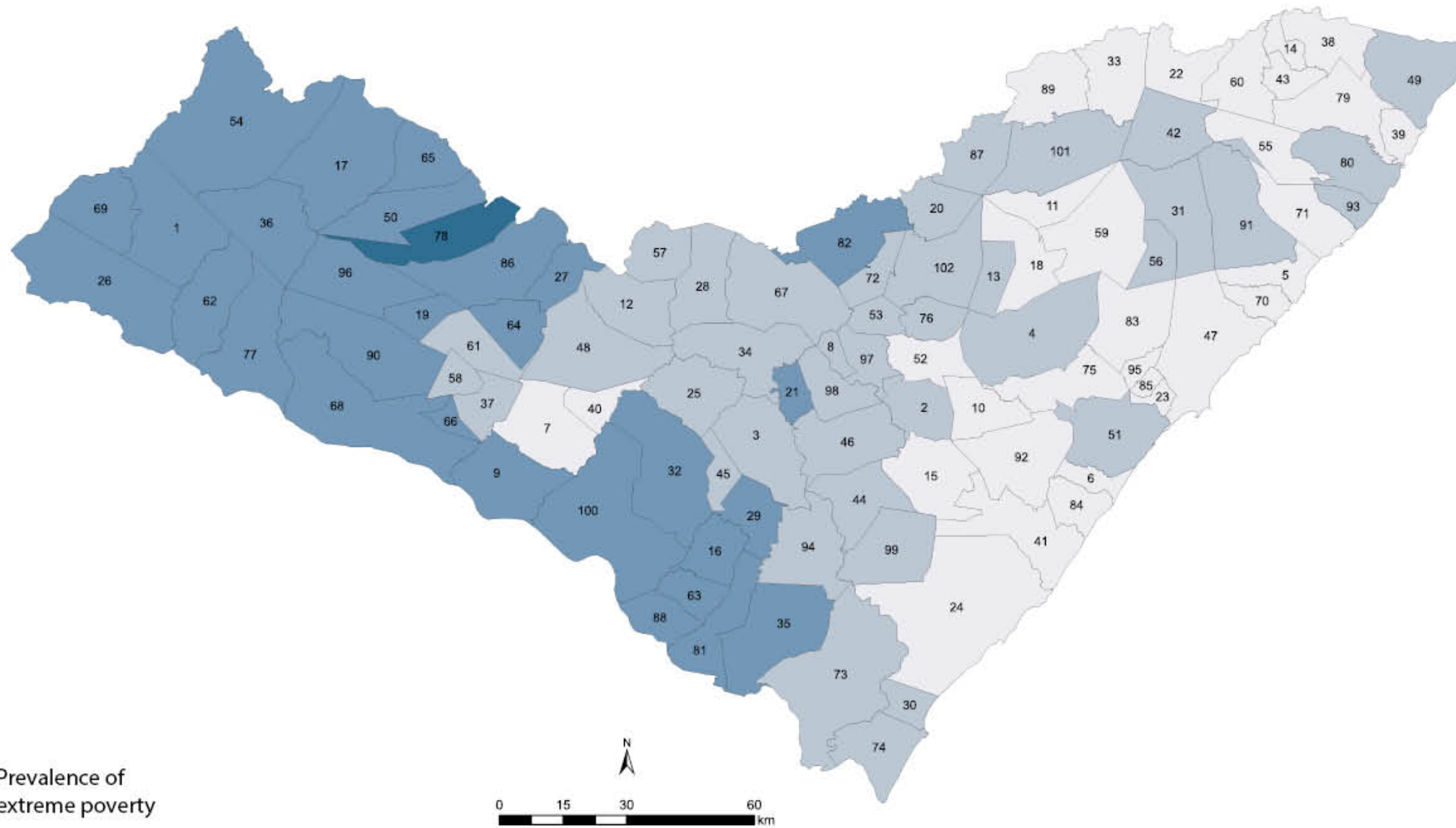

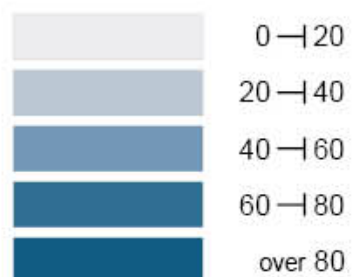


# Percentage of the population residing in agricultural households in extreme poverty

Prevalence of extreme poverty



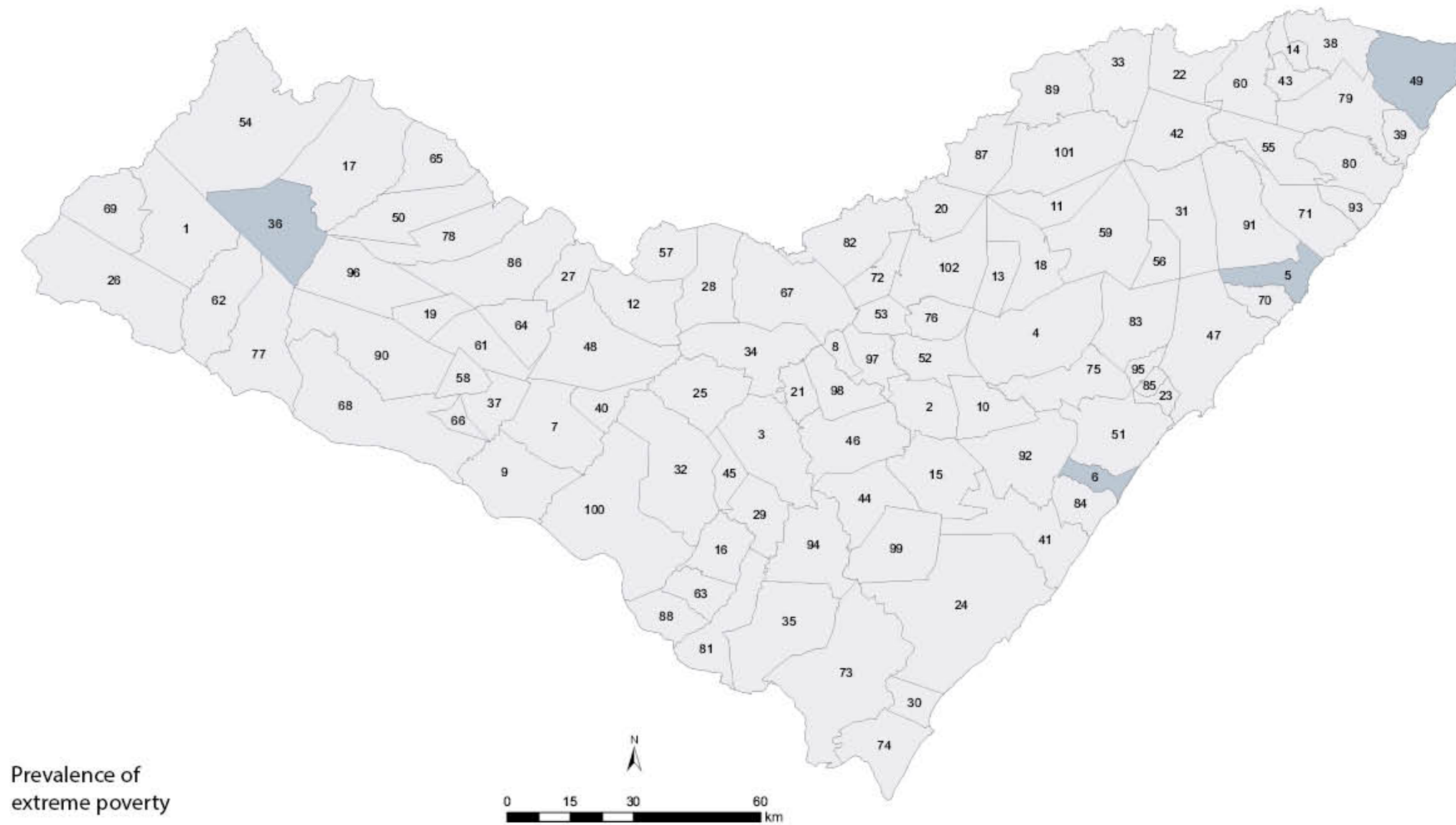

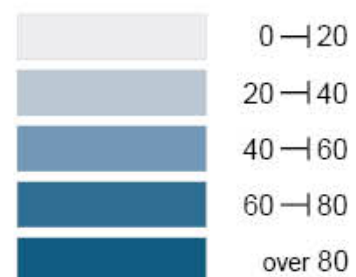

Prevalence of extreme poverty



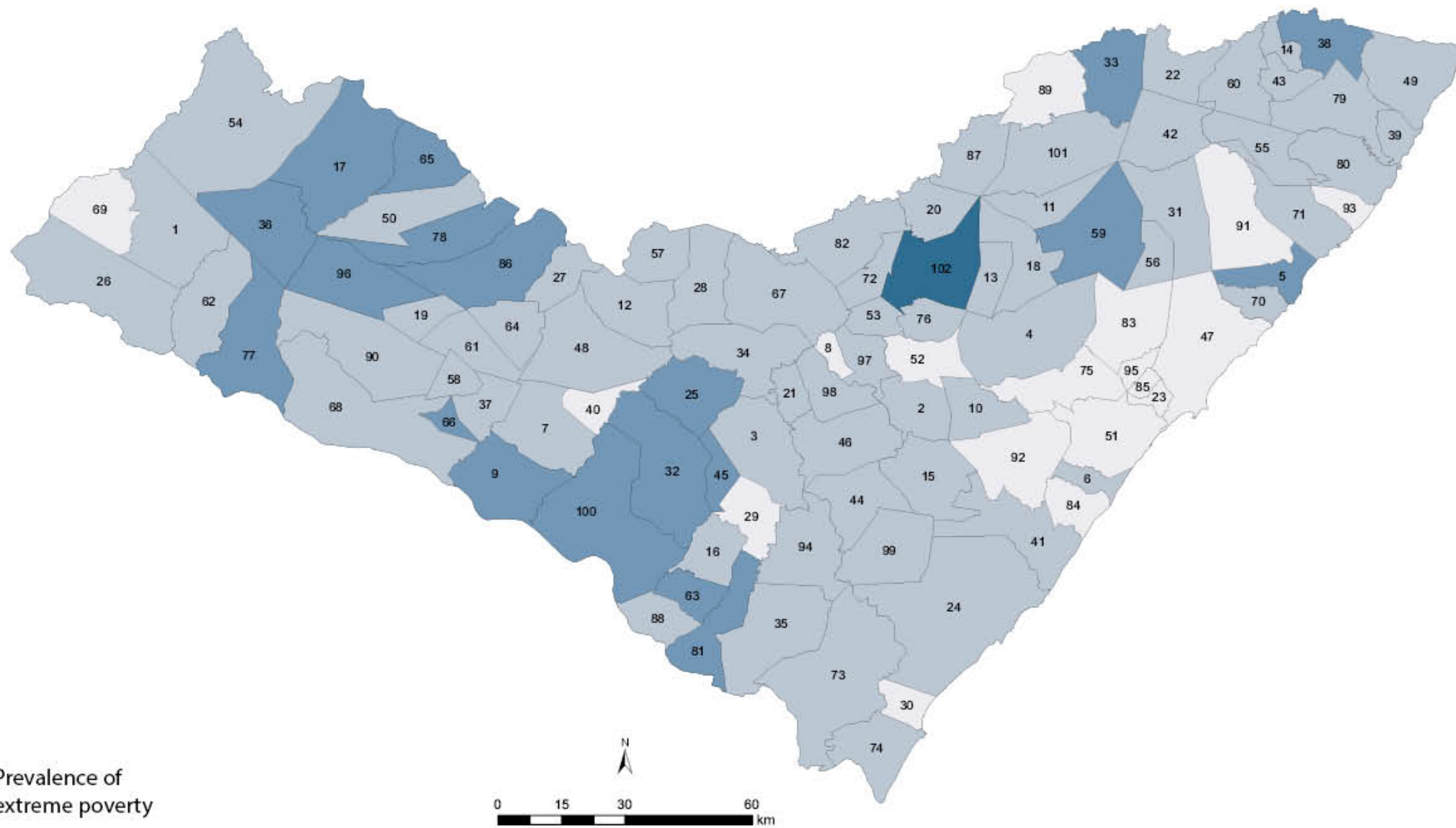

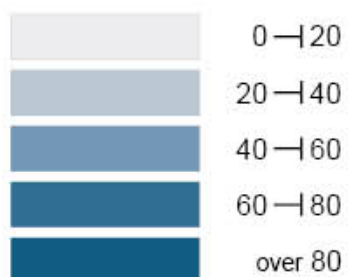

Prevalence of extreme poverty



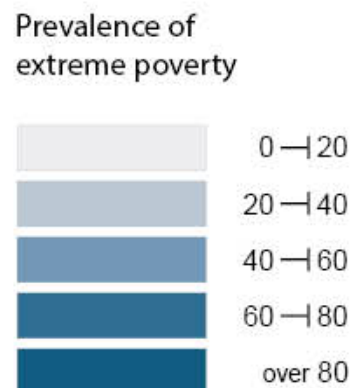
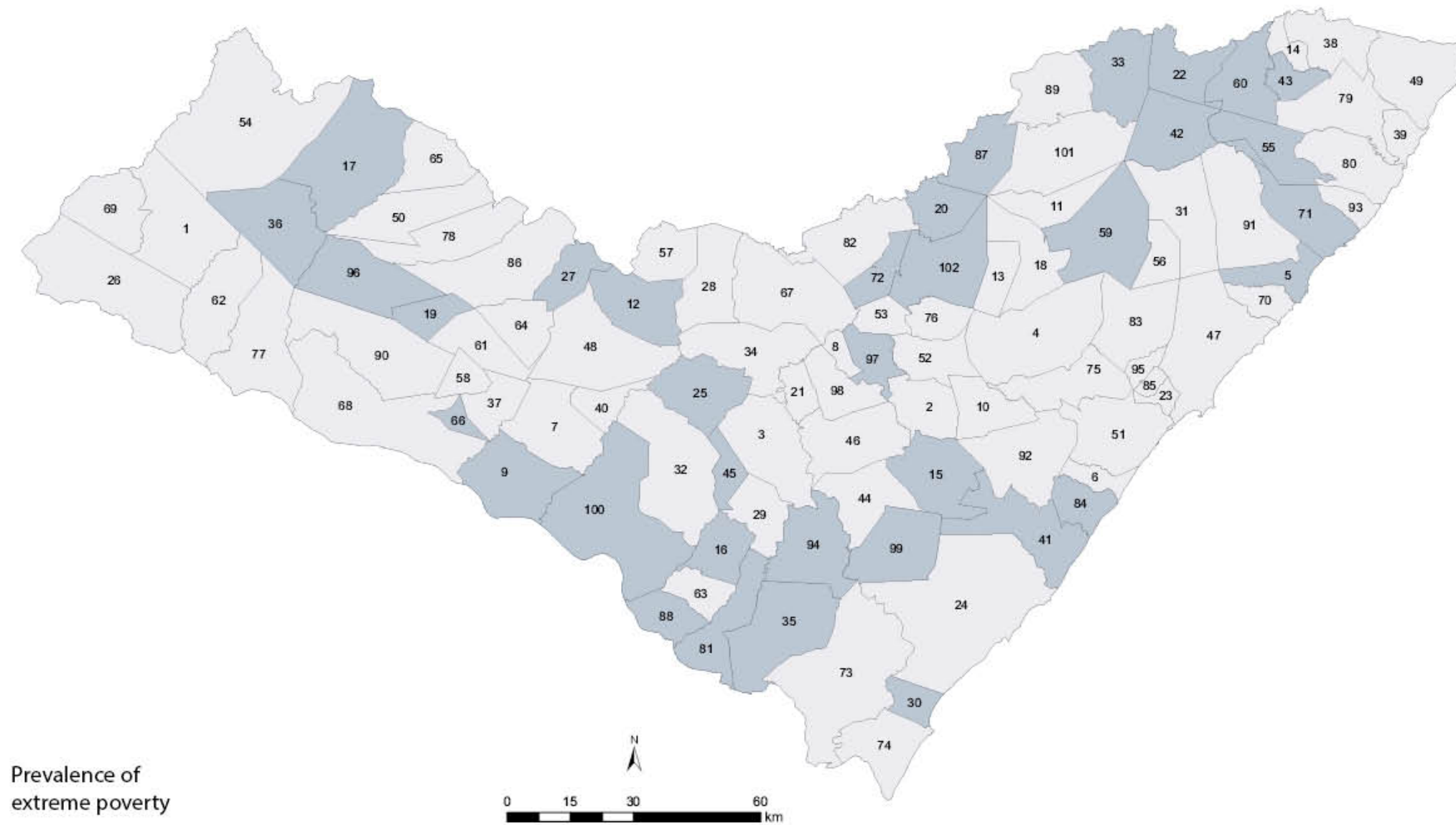

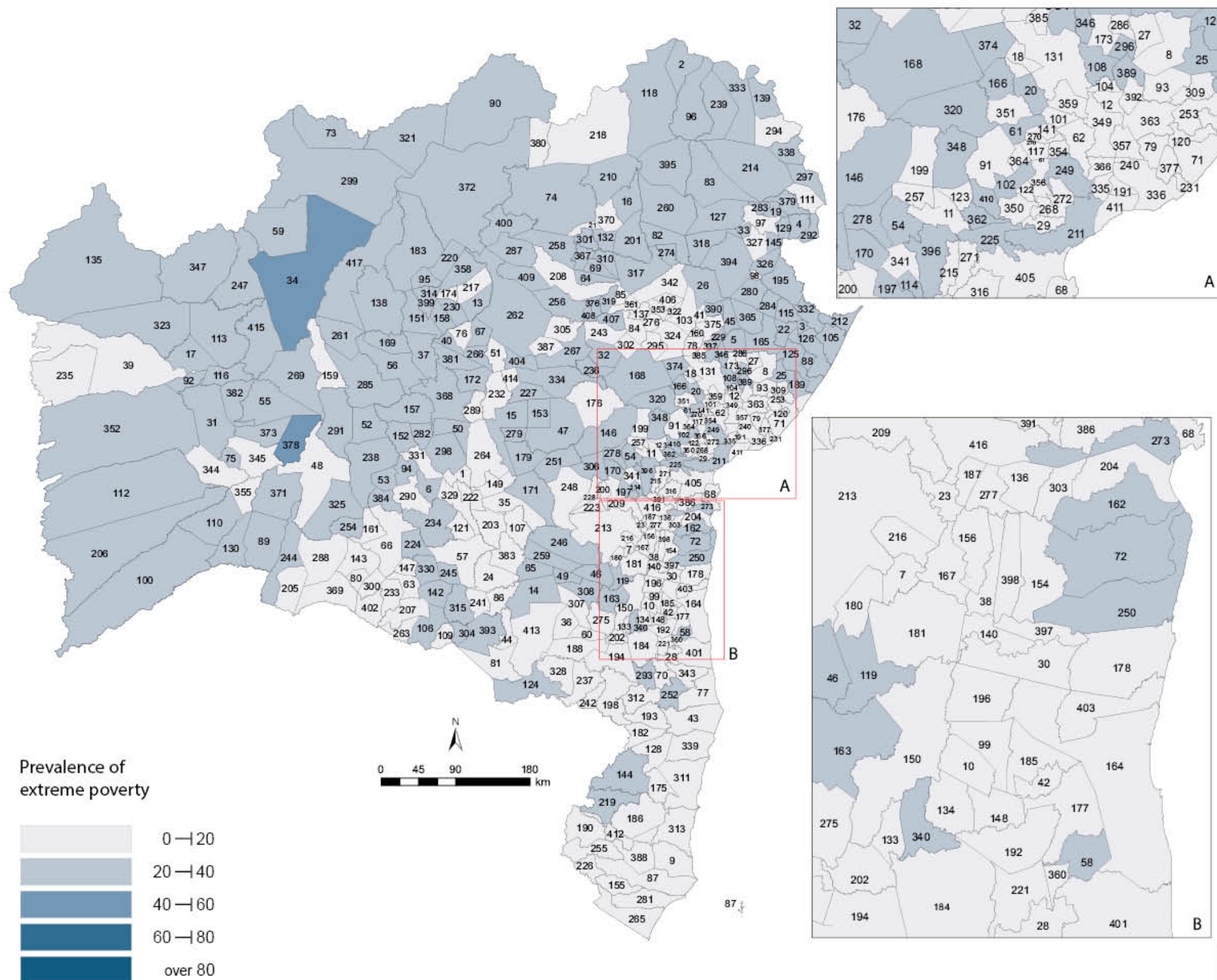

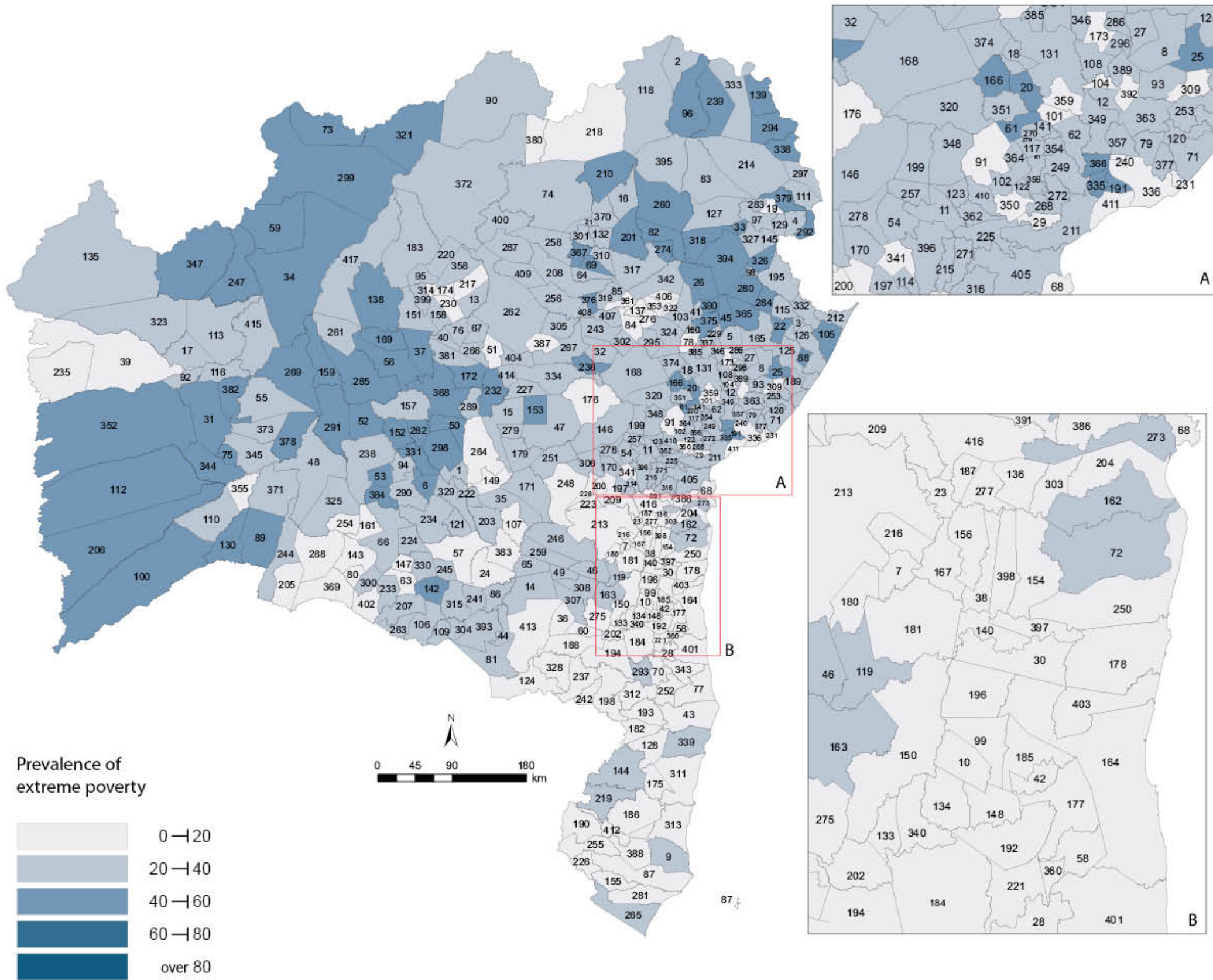

(monthly per capita household income of up to BRL70)—Bahia, 2010



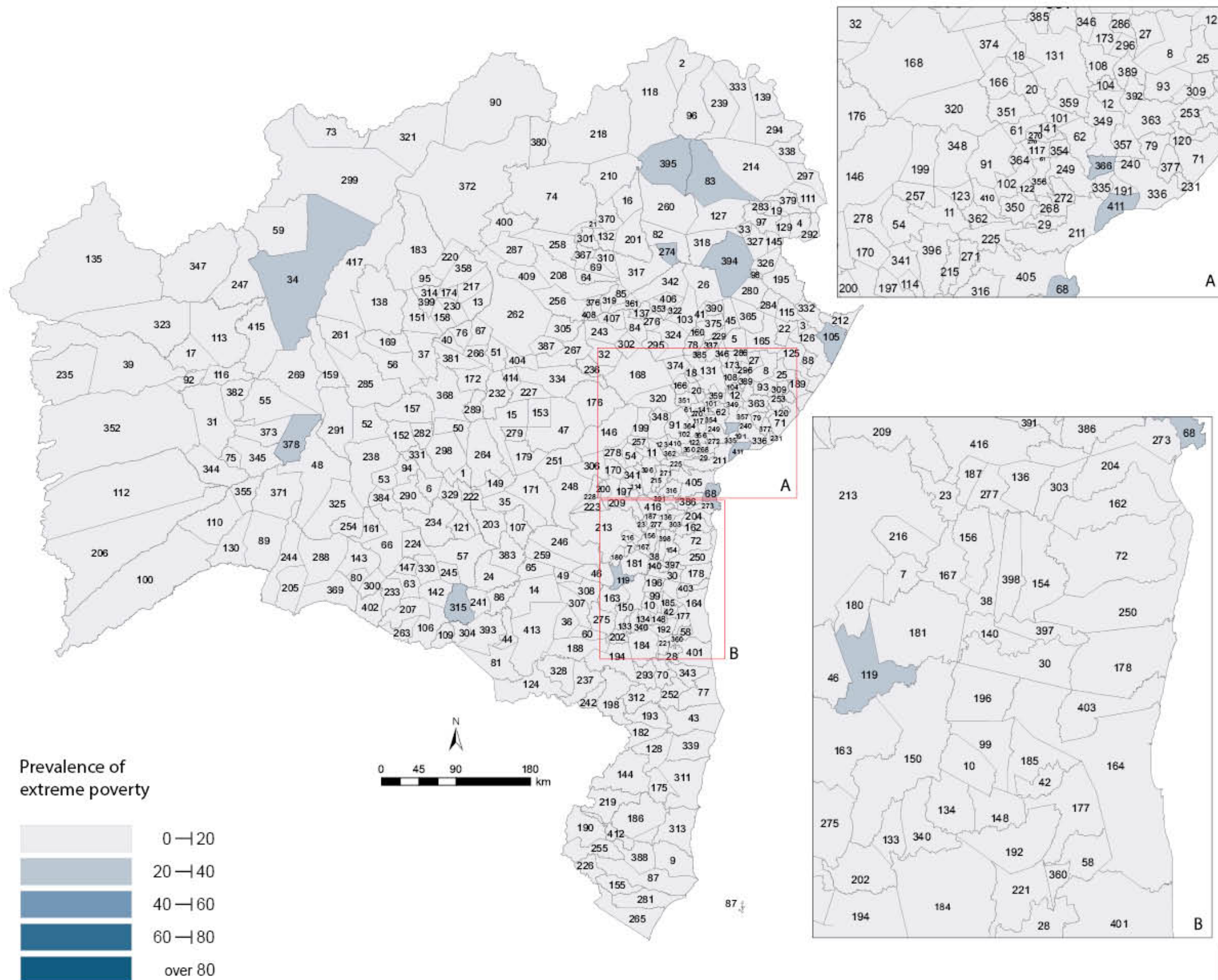

(monthly per capita household income of up to BRL70)—Bahia, 2010



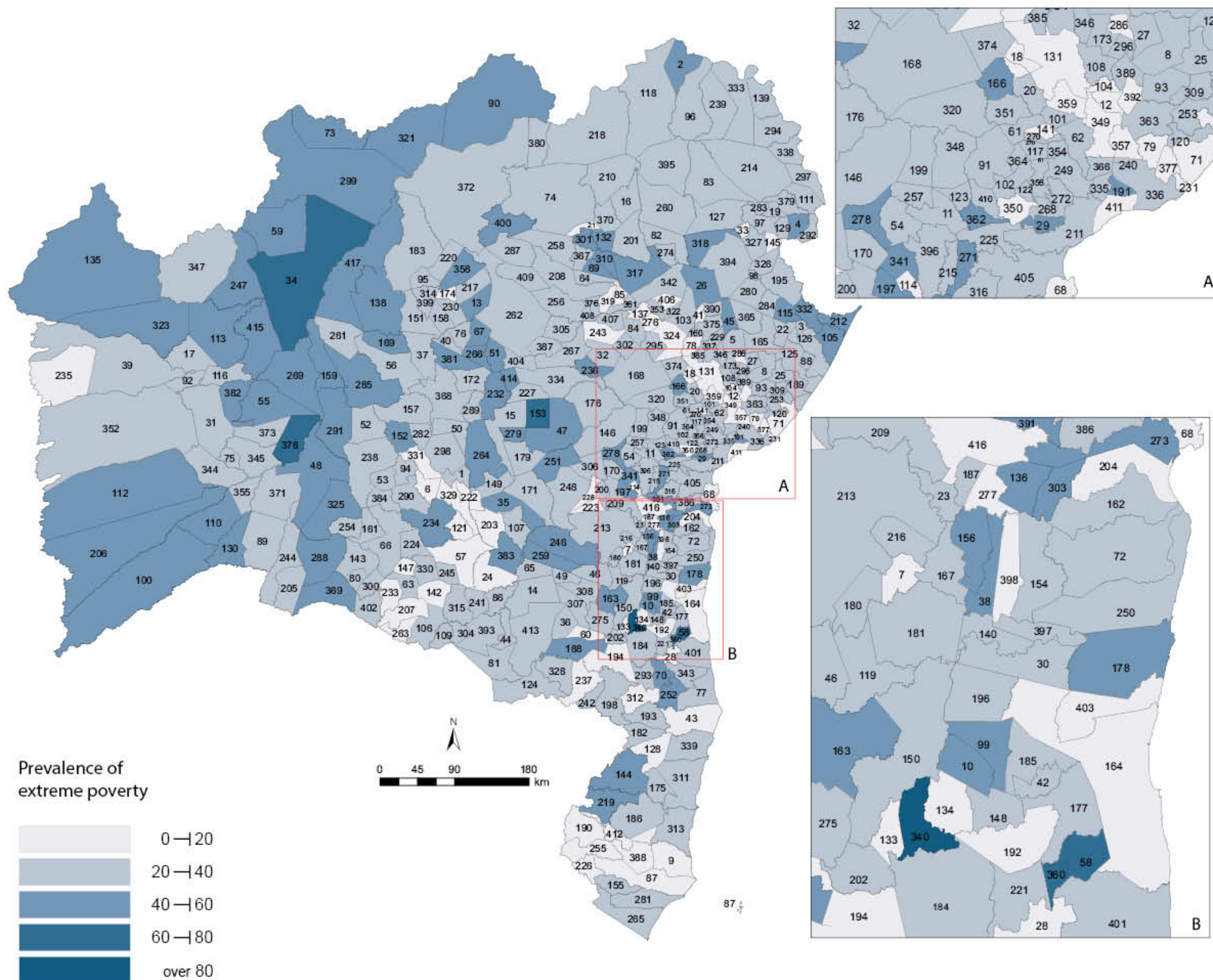

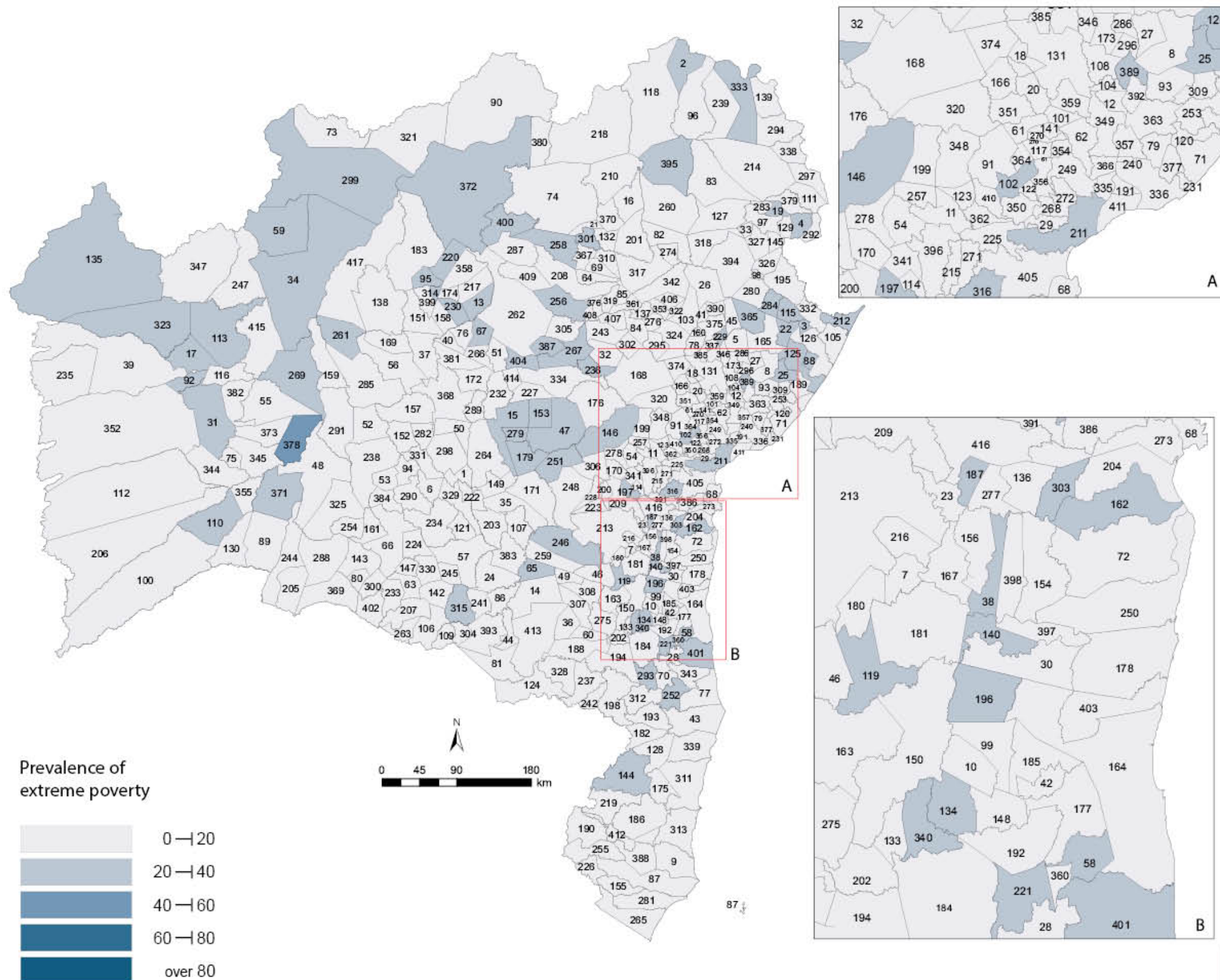

# Percentage of the population residing in agricultural households in extreme poverty

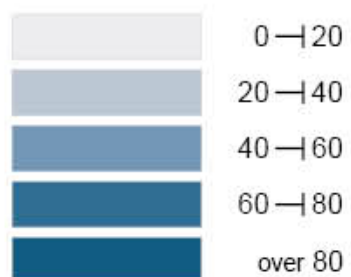

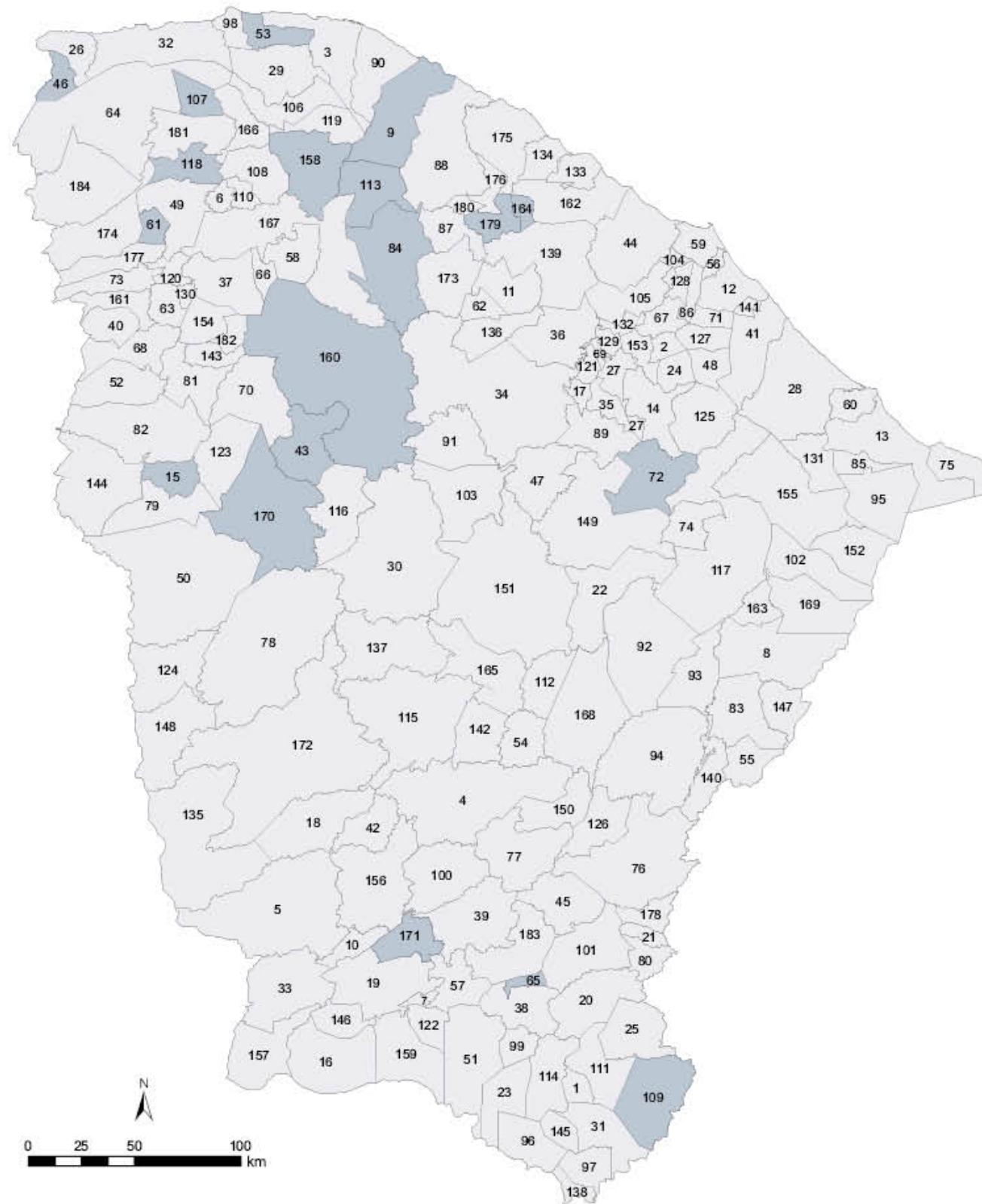

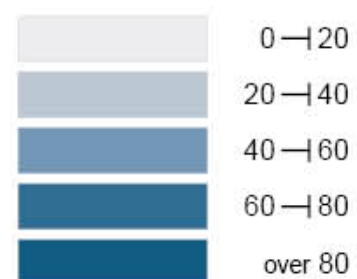

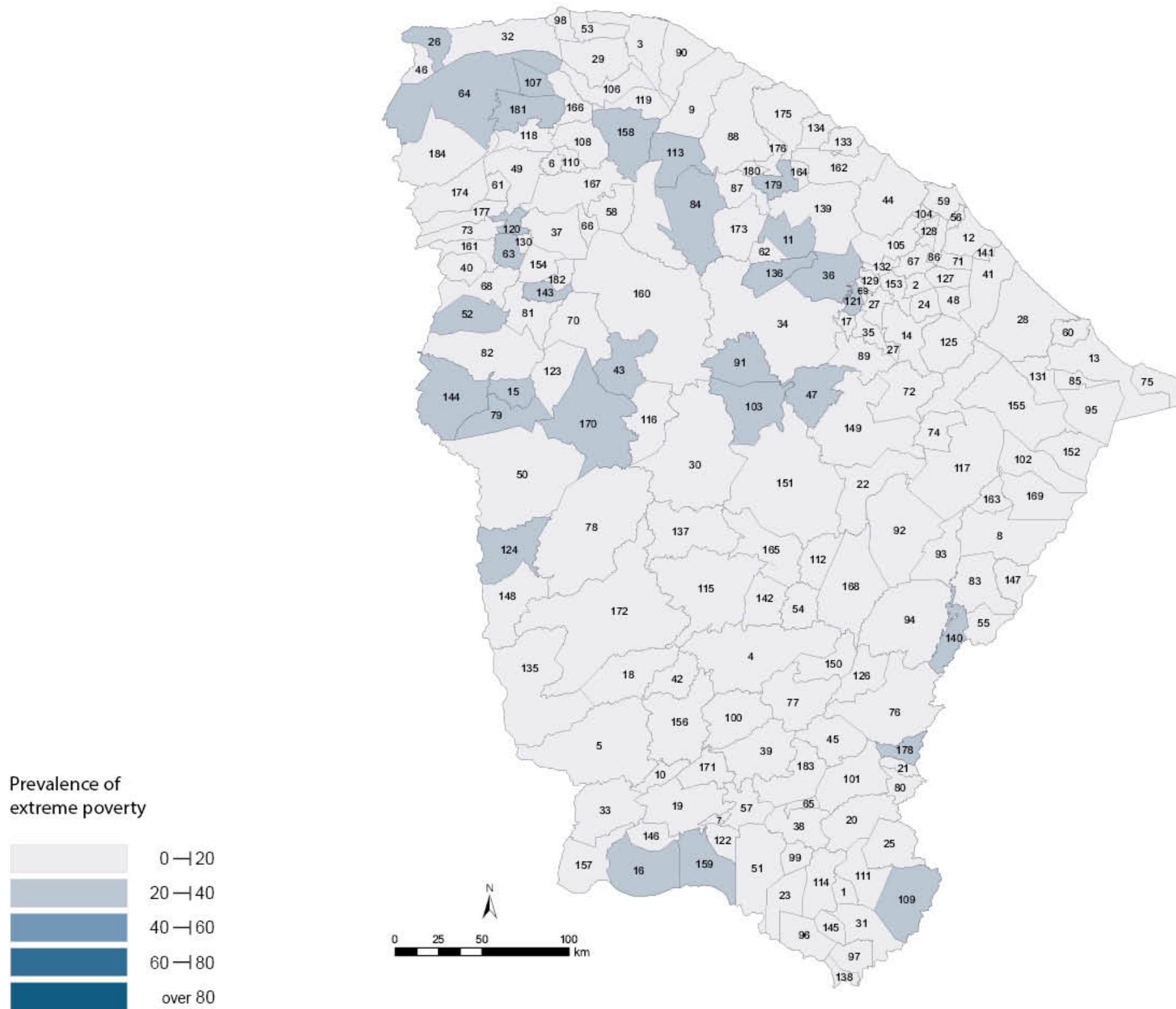

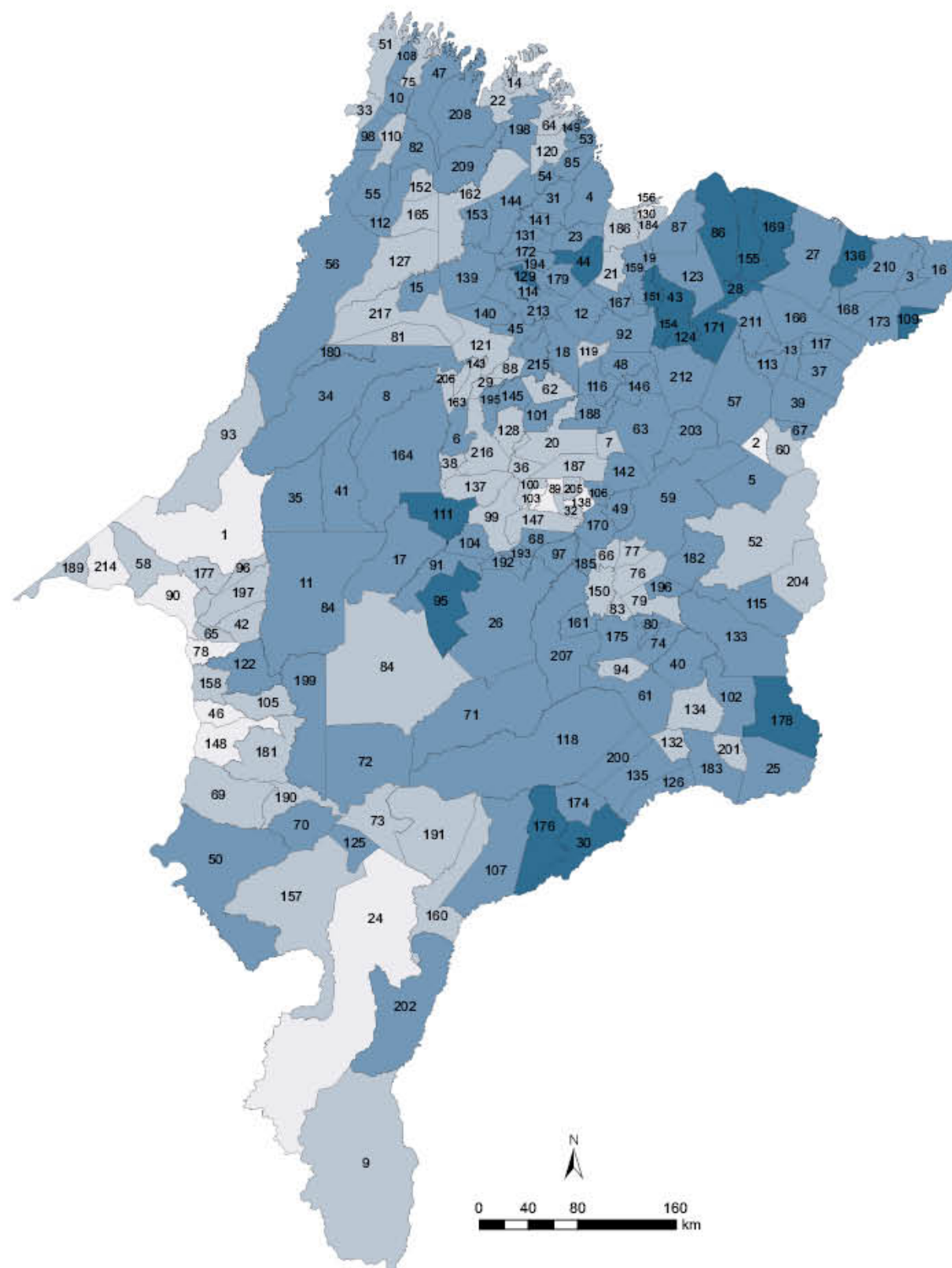

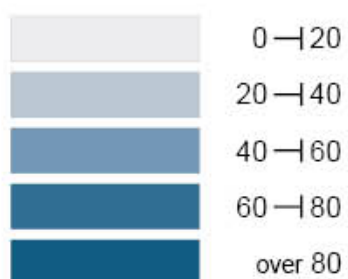

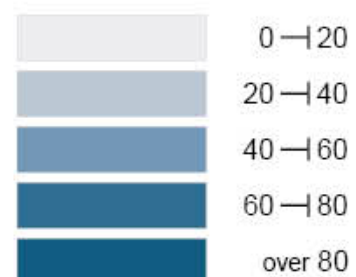


# Percentage of the population living in extreme poverty

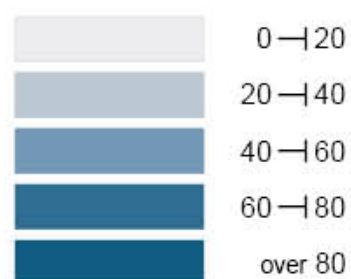

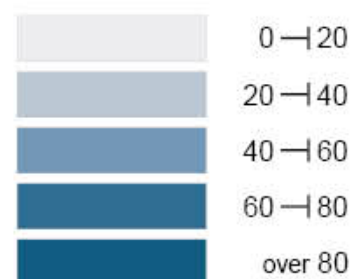

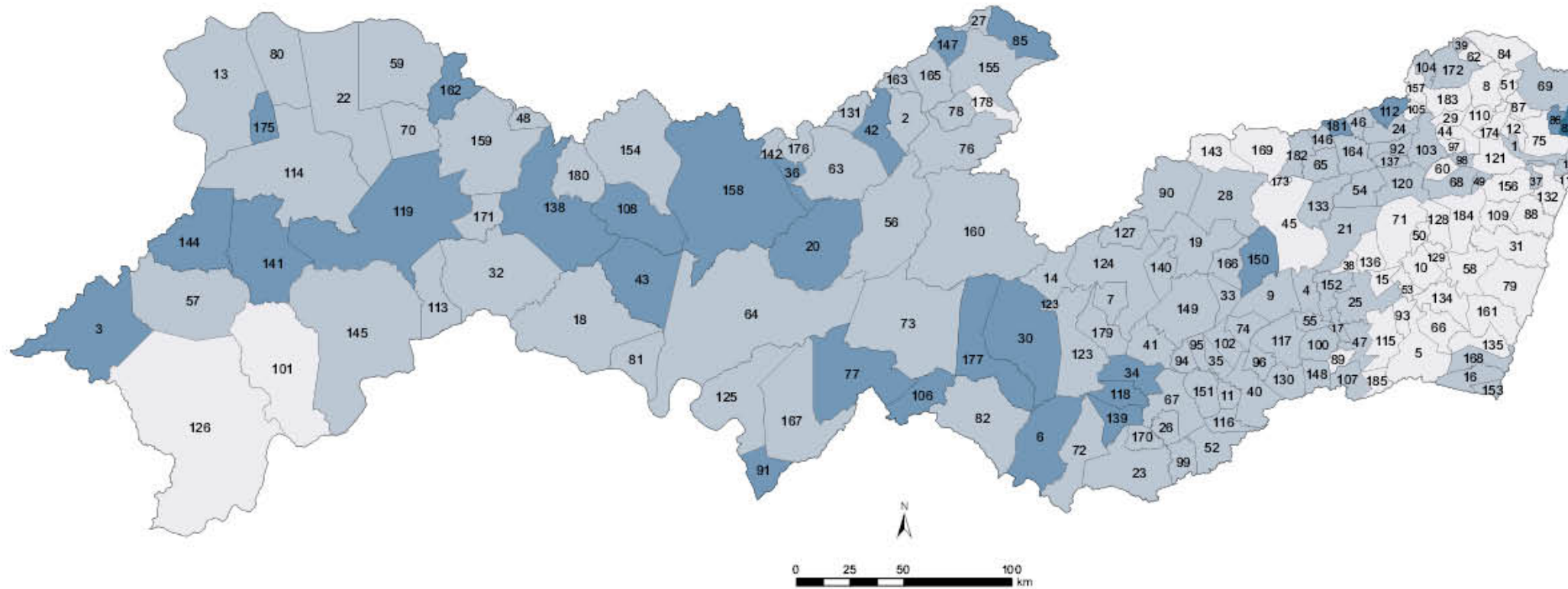

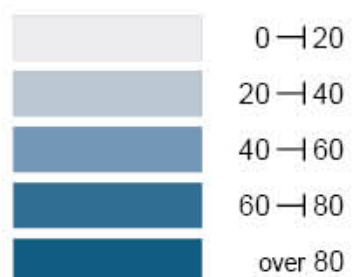

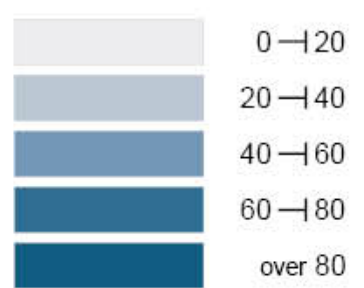

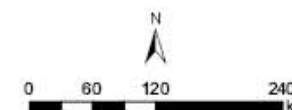
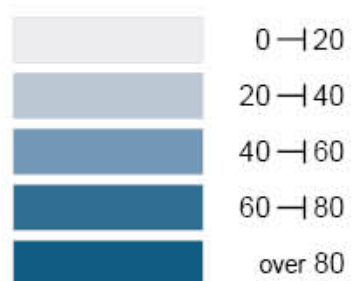


# Percentage of the population residing in agricultural households in extreme poverty

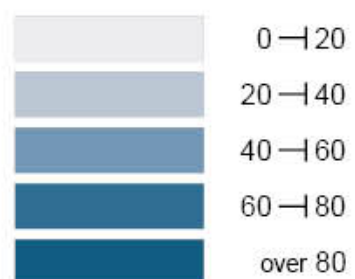
